John W. Adams Distinguished Service Award

The DSA is the highest award given by a local Church of the Nazarene to a layperson. Our DSA is appropriately named after Rev. John Adams. Rev. Adams was the son of a sharecropper with a second grade education who God called into ministry as an adult. His wife taught him to read in order pass courses for ordination. He pastored WCN from 1959-1973. Rev. Adams was a bi-vocational pastor. He worked during the week and he pastored on weeknights and weekends. He physically built and remodeled our facilities. The Lord used him to impact many people in our church and in our community. Rev. John Adams was a model servant. His humility, his willingness to serve, and his dedication to the work of the church over a long period of time are traits of a Distinguished Servant. It is fitting that this award be attached to his name.

Each year a recipient is chosen by a pool of past DSA recipients. *It takes a servant to know a servant.* Recipients of this award have committed themselves to a lifetime of service in the name of Jesus. It is with great honor and appreciation that this award is distributed annually.

Your Church board meets the 2nd Monday evening of each month and prayerfully seeks God's will in decisions concerning WCN. The meetings are open for anyone to attend. Those you elected to serve on the 2018-19 Church board were SS Superintendent Robin May (21), NMI President Pearl Jones (21), Betty Hamm (21), Brenda Palk (21), Diane Davis (21), Don McGuire (20), Karen Woodside (20), Mac Anderson (20), Jana Brazzle (19), Marilyn Evans (19), and Terry Langston (19). Parentheses denotes year term ends.

We updated WCN's mission statement: WCN is a sent community embodying Christ-like transformation throughout Humphreys County and beyond by calling people to Belong, Believe, and Become. We welcomed Pastor Grace Savage as she served as pastor for our youth for a few months. The Board updated the Transportation policy. Many faithfully gathered for the 4:30 am prayer meetings as we continue to seek His direction and will for a new building. A loan acquisition team began working to find potential lenders and a pre-construction team was appointed to begin preliminary work for building with a target start date of Spring '19. We entered into a 6-month contract with a realtor to list our current properties. We were blessed by Dr. David Graves for our Homecoming Service. Dr. Dwight Gunter led us in days of Renewal. After many years of faithful service, Pearl Jones stepped down as NMI President. The Board elected Sarah Shanks to serve the remainder of Pearl's term and Pearl continued to serve as vice-president. You continued to believe in mission work as you helped send volunteer servants for Mission: Mexico, providing shoes and clean water filters to those in need. Many participated in several intergenerational missional projects. You loved the Military Veterans of our community by paying their admission to view the spiritual-based movie *Invincible*. You continually gave faithfully to send kids to church camps & other events as needs are posted on the Sending Wall. The Discovery Care and Celebrate Recovery programs continued to be a blessing and many humbly volunteered to serve. We honored our wonderful pastors and showered them with gifts, cards and love for Pastors' Appreciation. We expressed appreciation to Terry Langston for 30 years of selfless service as our Worship leader. Wednesday night Immerse Groups continued to grow, led by a wonderful group of staff and lay persons willing to lead. We welcomed the beginning of Advent with the Hanging of the Greens and instruction on the Christian Calendar as families assembled Advent trees to display in their homes. WCN observed a season of Sabbath.

We graciously and proudly shared our pastors with others as they were sought to lead revivals, train other pastors and assist with Pastoral Reviews. As several in our own congregation experienced sickness, death and tragedy you were the Church as you loved, prayed, fed and comforted.

We are blessed by obedient and faithful pastors, staff and lay persons who are humbled to serve and give as God calls. Together, by praying and serving, we are the Church!

<u>Treasurer's Report – 2018-2019</u>

WCN ends the year in our best financial shape ever. Your Donations were solid across all categories, with Building Fund Giving greatly exceeding expectation and Tithes & Offerings spot on the forecast. Our Expenses closely tracked budget/forecast with most expense categories flat or down year-over-year.

In recent months, both attendance and donations have been trending higher. This is a good sign as we enter this season of construction. Also, we have streamlined several ministries to allow us to grow our 'Rainy Day' funds and to prepare for that eventual monthly mortgage payment. So far, that strategy is working well.

As of Vision Sunday (4/28/201), the total Building Fund stands at \$1,042,642. In the meantime, we've spent \$73,502 toward the Architect and Civil Engineering work needed at this stage. Your giving toward the Building Fund has been amazing. We encourage you to keep up the progress toward our goal of a new facility.

We have each of you to thank for your faithful giving. We can only continue to pursue Kingdom work in Humphreys County and beyond with your support and your financial support in the past year was tremendous!

I need to recognize our teams of 'Counters'. They enter the records that eventually become your giving statements. It is their work that ensures those numbers are correct and they also protect your donations all the way to the bank. They consist of a 'Sunday team' (Kay McGranahan, Jan Fitzgerald, Jane Langston, and Ross Marek) and a 'Monday team' (Carla Anderson, Rose Mitchell, and Linda Story). Rose Mitchell has taken Tina Walters counting slot in recent months in a seamless transition. A special 'Thank You' to all our counters.

NMI (National Missions International) Report for 2018-2019

Dear Church Family,

First let me thank you for allowing me to be your NMI President. Thank you especially to Pastor Daron Brown, and Pastor Mary Forester. Both of you have been so helpful. I took over this position, mid-year from your previous President Mrs. Pearl Jones. As all this is new, and I am still learning, I appreciate your patience with me.

As we are a people called of God to go and preach the gospel (Mark 16:15; Romans 10:13-14), it is our responsibility to listen for the voice of the Holy Spirit giving us direction. We are to send, and we are to support those who go. We are to aid in the building of God's Kingdom around the world. (Mark 13:10)

And the gospel must first be preached to all nations.

These are some of the ways WCN has participated in this mission this year:

150 pairs of Shoes that Grow were purchased and sent to Mexico with our missions group of 25+ people. While in Mexico our group aided in building a feeding station for the village. The ladies in our group held a 'health clinic' and gave foot care. We were the first missions group to ever visit their area.

A 'Sending Wall' was added to our Church. This wall has envelopes attached with money amounts indicated on the outside. This wall was utilized prior to our mission trip, allowing our congregation to participate in giving toward the cost of the trip. Each person who gave, and/or prayed for this trip, in essence, went.

Following the trip to Mexico our group (which also included several people from Griffins Chapel in Erin TN) gave our church a colorful report on the trip. Lots of pictures and stories were shared and enjoyed.

\$1000.00 was collected by our Children, and 25 Water filters were purchased and sent to areas which did not have clean water.

On June 24, 2018, Doctors Bruce and Peggy Odoms, President of Asia Pacific Nazarene Theological Seminary, came and spoke with us.

Our contributions this year are as follows; Our World Evangelism Fund (WEF) obligation is paid at 100% in the amount of \$33,440.72. We gave \$1410.18 in Alabaster Offering.

This year we are sending the following people as delegates to our District NMI Convention: Betty Hamm, Rose Mitchell, Adriana Batchelder, Glenda Davidson, Rachel Reynen, Susie Parnell, Tracy Cavness, Mary Ann Collins, BriAnn Selph, Lisa Oakley, Linda Story, Valerie Fuller, Marie Stirman, Kathryn McGuire, Bradley Selph, and Kelsey Elliot. I thank each one of these wonderful people for giving their time to missions and to serving.

2018/2019 PASTOR OF LOCAL MISSIONS REPORT

WES PARTNERSHIP – WCN has completed 9 years of partnership with WES. This past year WCN served as greeters in the mornings and with gifts of service throughout the year. Pastor Mary Forester is in the school almost daily ministering to students and teachers. Teachers and Staff were thanked with an end of the year meal, letters, cards, and a small gift. Ten teachers received a check to purchase needed items for their class rooms. WCN's teachers who teach at schools other than WES received a thank you gift card in appreciation for investing in the lives of the children. Thank you to Pastor Mary Forester for leading this partnership and to Jana Brazzle for organizing the delicious meal.

<u>FUEL</u> – The FUEL program has completed 14 years. The FUEL program places food in the backpacks of hungry kids each Friday of the school year. WCN partners with 4 other area churches in this ministry. The program serves Pre-K through 8th grade and for the 1st time has served WCHS's special needs class. WCN served 32 of the 119 children in the program this past year. Thank you to Ellen Moran, Sarah Palk, Emily Palk, Frankie Oakley, Wynona Gwin, Jan Fitzgerald, Carla Anderson, Tracy Cavness, Brooke Marek, Glenda Davidson, Cheryl Woodside, and Jill Field for their hard work and commitment to this vital ministry.

<u>HELPING HANDS</u> – WCN continues to partner with our local food pantry to provide food and financial assistance to families in Humphreys Co. Helping Hands continues to partner with Second Harvest Food Bank. The food truck ministry has change delivery times but continues to serve 130 - 150 families at the special distribution times. <u>GROUP HOME PARTY</u> – WCN marked 29 years in December of 2018 of celebrating Christmas with special friends in our community. Thank you to Buddy Bishop, Sheila Bishop, Kay McGranahan, Pastor Mary Forester, and everyone who serve to help make this event the most special event of the year.

Jail and Recovery Ministries - 3/1/2018 - 2/28/2019

<u>Jail Ministry</u>: WCN has had two great teams this past year with which I served! Thank you to Dan Troxell, Mac Anderson, Charles Davidson, Betty Hamm, Carla Anderson, and Jan Troxell. They've been faithful every Tuesday and Thursday of the year to lead the church services to the men and women in the Humphreys County Jail. The prayer team of 40 persons, who receive specific prayer requests submitted by the inmates weekly, have continued to undergird this ministry.

Again, as a loving congregation, your cookie-baking was greatly appreciated by the jail recipients on Valentine's Day, along with Valentine cards made! Know that room exists for expanding our team if the Lord lays it on your heart!

<u>Celebrate Recovery Ministry:</u> WCN completed its first full year of Celebrate Recovery and began its second year the first Thursday of 2019! The CR team is comprised of Hostesses, Worship Leaders, Breakout Group Leaders and assistants, Childcare Providers, Security, Sound Technician, and Meal Coordinators. This past year's team members were as follows: Betty Hamm, Jan Troxell, Susie Parnell, Vernon Costello, Lloyd Ross, Tracy Young, Ellen Moran, Sarah Shanks, Darrel Shanks, Glenda Davidson, Lindy Dellinger, Julie Coleman, Nathaniel Riley, Warren Patrick, Fran Patrick, Trent Riley, Luanne Riley, Marilyn Evans, Gary Evans and Chuck Ellis. A few older teenagers have assisted in various ways in the Joint Session as childcare helpers, sound techs, and *floats* – J.J. Coleman, Hannah Troxell, Harley Balthrop, Haley and Addie Irons. Also, the following Sunday School classes supplied the refreshments once per month: the Joy Class, the New Life Class, the Rolling Stones Class, and the Table. Thank you!!

The 2018 fall Immerse Groups offered as one of its options CR Leadership Training. The sessions were well attended and more joined our team the following year, while some took a break although offering to be "on call" for occasional service as needed. Both scheduled and non-scheduled team members are a real blessing! Also, a men's CR Step Study group has been underway on Tuesday evenings as a closed group for those persons wanting to go deeper in spiritual formation. The women's Step Study group completed its curriculum in February of this year.

I've been excited to see that WCN's CR has been a connecting link for men and women released from the jail to engage in recovery. At the same time, CR has served as a safe place for any persons needing healing from hurts and losses. Many persons in our congregation and family members of those persons have been touched by the CR Joint Session, following Open Breakout Groups, Mix and Mingle time, pastoral follow up, and in some cases the mentoring one-to-one commitments. For the twelve-month length of this church year, 103 individuals have attended – affording them truth, love, acceptance, accountability, and support.

As we move further into this year, I continue to be moved by the following quote: *The future belongs to those who believe in their God-given dreams*. God has given WCN a calling to reach out and help meet the deep needs of others. Recovery is a big part of those needs. This annual report is our time to check our pulse. We continue to see increases in every statistical area. For the reporting year we averaged 278 in worship attendance (+4) and 194 in Sunday School (+9). We increased in membership and baptisms. We rejoice over these numbers and the outputs on page 3.
